

PESA Doctoral and Postgraduate Research Activities and Presentation Awards

The Society supports doctoral students and pre-doctoral postgraduate students to advance serious philosophical discussion about education. It is the intention of the awards sub-committee to award several Doctoral and Postgraduate Research Activities and Presentation awards each year. The sub-committee will provide two types of awards:

- 1. research grants, and
- 2. awards for high-quality presentations at PESA conferences

The total value of all awards will be up to AUD10,000.

Applying for awards

Research grants

Send your application by email to the Society secretary at <u>secretary@pesa.org.au</u> by 1-September.

Your application should include:

- A brief proposal of up to 2,000 words, detailing what your research is about and what aspect of your research you need financial assistance with.
- An overview of the costs to be met.
- An endorsement by your supervisors.

Funding may be provided for editing, research materials, assistance with travel, attending writing retreats, and other activities that the sub-committee determines to be relevant.

Applications will mainly be assessed according to how key the research activity is to the doctoral/postgraduate project.

High-quality doctoral/postgraduate presentations awards

Awards may be given to high-quality presentations given by doctoral/postgraduate students at PESA conferences. High-quality presentations will be those with significant philosophical content, and those that are succinct and clear, engaging, and have a degree of novelty. There is no application process for these awards.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- a) Be enrolled as a candidate for the degree Doctor of Philosophy, Masters, or another similar research degree with the agreement of the Scholarship Manager.
- b) Have an active membership with the Philosophy of Education Society of Australasia at the time of application.

Presentation of the awards

Research grant and award recipients will be announced at the annual conference of the Society.

Research grant recipients are required to present at the annual conference of the Philosophy of Education Society of Australasia in the same year that the grant is award. After this presentation, the Society will pay the recipient the grant.

Grand and award management

The awards are managed for the Society by the Scholarships Manager. The Executive of the Philosophy of Education Society has the right to alter the rules of these awards at any time and not to make awards for any reason.
